"He replied to him, 'You have answered correctly; do this and you will live.'" In today's Gospel a scholar questions Jesus about how to gain eternal life. In case anyone ever wonders whether heaven is within reach, one only needs to refer to this Gospel. Jesus provides a clear answer that gives us a clear plan of action: We are to love God with all that we are, and also to

love our neighbors. Really, it's that simple! The scholar, however, complicated things to make himself look better. Instead of accepting the simplicity of Jesus' instruction, he wanted to split hairs, asking, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied with the story of the Good Samaritan and the lesson that our neighbors are not just those we know or love. Rather, our neighbor is the person that needs our help, the person whom we would rather ignore, the person whom God puts in our path. In short, everyone is our neighbor and we are called to treat everyone with mercy. This is part of how we gain eternal life! But this flows from the first element of Jesus' answer. First and foremost, Jesus instructs us to love God "with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind." When we love God in this way, truly as the Lord of our life, then loving our neighbors becomes the easy part. When our hearts and minds are full of the love of God who loves all people then it will necessarily follow that we too will desire to share that love with others and not count the cost! The Good Samaritan is an excellent example of this kind of love. Without hope of repayment, he gave of his time and his money to help the poor victim. But in return, the Samaritan will surely "gain eternal life."

Indulgences: Receiving communion reconciled and in the state of Grace as often as possible is the best action for partial or plenary remission for either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin. That is why we have in our traditional spiritual devotions first Fridays and first Saturdays. These two devotions are both reparatory devotions in the Catholic Church that arose from separate private revelations. The First Friday devotion is associated with the Sacred Heart of Jesus, while the First Saturday devotion is associated with the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Incidentally, these are two of the most widely popular devotions to Jesus and Mary. Both devotions involve receiving Holy Communion on a certain number of consecutive first Fridays and/or first Saturdays of the month. You can think of it almost like a novena which is prayed on nine consecutive days for a particular intention, while these devotions are performed on consecutive months for the particular intention of reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, respectively.

Mission Appeal - Prelature of Esquel (Argentina - Patagonia)
Dear Parishioners of St. Charles Borromeo, The Weekend of **July 23/24,** - is a Mission Appeal Sunday in your parish. This year I invite you to support the missionary work of **Prelature of Esquel (Patagonia)** in the country of our Pope Francis, Argentina. This mission was created in 2009 and covers more than 30,000 square miles and has a population of about 70,000 habitants. Presently six diocesan priests and 7 religious (seven Polish Redemptorists) serve in eleven parishes in the new Prelature. The people in these communities are very poor and unable to support their parishes. Without funds collected during Mission Appeal Prelature of Esquel cannot sustain its pastoral work e.g. evangelization activities, children and youth catechetical programs, lay ministry training, help for the poor and can't continue construction of new churches for the young catholic communities. Your Mission Cooperative Preacher will be **Fr. Wojciech Kusek** who works for the Prelature of Esquel. Blessed Pope John Paul II reminded us in his encyclical 'Rich in Mercy': "Jesus Christ taught that man not only receives and experiences the mercy of God, but that he is also called to practice mercy towards others."
