2nd Collection: Next weekend, March 25/26 we will have a collection for Catholic Relief Services. "What is the **difference** between this **Catholic Relief Services (CRS) 2nd Collection** and the **CRS Rice Bowl**?" and "Why do they have the 2nd Collection for CRS right in the middle of the CRS Rice Bowl?" The CRS Rice Bowl and the CRS 2nd Collection are not the same and the money is allocated differently. 1) CRS 2nd Collection helps fund several different USCCB offices that all work towards providing relief towards those who are vulnerable to poverty in the United States and around the world. The 2nd collection was named the "CRS 2nd Collection" due to it was the most recognized office of the USCCB, from the list of offices, that receive a portion of the collection. The date for the collection is chosen by the USCCB Collections Office, which just happens to coincide with the CRS Lenten Rice Bowl.
